

Toys for Children 2-4 Years of Age



Magnetic Letters Set

Great for fine motor skills, Visual/Color Recognition, Letter and Number Sequencing



Leap Frog "My Own Leap Top"

Beneficial for fine motor skills, animal trivia, the alphabet, teaches music and sound, as well as computer literacy.



Sit and Spin

This toy promotes balance, core strength and coordination.



Gator Grabber Tweezers

Resistance activities enhance intrinsic muscles and grasp/prehension for improved pencil grip, increased fine motor endurance and dexterity. Froggy Feeder Friends are good for color/number identification and and lateral arch/pinch development.



Lauri Stringing Peg and Pegboard Set

Pegboards combined with lacing and copying patterns/ shapes will simultaneously work on fine motor coordination and dexterity, grasp, pinch, eye hand coordination, visual motor skills (following pattern), color recognition and matching. Concentration and focus are also enhanced, as well as problem solving. Try having your child play this game on his or her belly to also work on shoulder stability.



Melissa and Doug Basic Skills Board

This button board puzzle is fun way to work on fasteners and perceptual skills at the same time. You child can create the bear puzzle, and each piece also has a different fastener to practice (buttons, zippers, snaps, clips, buckles and lacing). This activity will also enhance strength, grasp and pinch while using small finger muscles to work on fasteners.



EZ Tee Baseball

Helps your youngster develop gross motor skills, balance, coordination, motor planning and BUE usage/strength



See and Spell

Works on letter recognition, fine motor manipulation, visual motor skills and color identification



Gears! Gears! Gears!

Beginners Building Sets works on manipulation, visual motor skills, problem solving skills, color identification and creativity



Magnetic Pattern Blocks Set

Works on visual motor skills, fine motor manipulation, and problem solving skills

Great for fine motor/dexterity, problem solving and sequencing skills.



Twister

This game is good for left/right discrimination, motor planning, body scheme awareness, balance/coordination, upper and lower body strengthening



Rush Hour

Addresses executive functioning and planning skills, as well as perceptual awareness. Children have to slide blocks around to open paths on a grid, which also challenges sequential thinking and motor planning.



Hex Hive

Addresses executive functioning, planning and perceptual awareness. Sequential thinking and mental flexibility are also key components in this game. Small pieces that need to be placed with accuracy enhance fine motor control and dexterity.



3D Feel and Find

Children are given a puzzle outline tile and need to reach into the bag to Feel & Find the corresponding wooden shape. This is a great visual and tactile exercise that targets proprioception and stereognosis, as well as object naming. Can be played in a group for peer cooperative skill sand socialization.



What's in Ned's Head?

This game works on stereognosis and proprioception (understanding and identifying objects with hands instead of eyes) as well as decreasing tactile hypersensitivity. Children also learn flexible thinking, turn taking, and cooperation.



Apples to Apples Junior

This is great for learning cause and effect, problem solving, socialization and cognitive/language skills.

Scrabble

Great for socialization, problem solving, literacy skills and spelling.

Recommended Apps for iPhone & iPad

<u>Dexteria</u>- This app is good for fine motor skills essential for pre-handwriting. Promotes pincer grasp, utilization of the thumb and index finger as well as numerical/letter formation.

Writing Wizard- fine motor, letter and number recognition and formation.

Mr. Potato Head- Body scheme awareness, body part recognition and vocabulary, fine motor skills.

Thomas Match- Matching game, good for problem solving, memory, visual/spatial skills, number recognition.

Coloring + - Coloring app, good for fine motor, memory skills, colors vocabulary.

My Play Home- Open ended "dollhouse" app, good for household vocabulary development.

StoryMaker Free- Children can create their own storybook by creating pages with illustrations and text. They can draw their own pictures or choose images from various categories. This app is great for learning vocabulary and story grammar (learning concepts of main characters, plot, main idea, conclusion, etc.), as well as fostering creativity.





Toca Monsters and Toca Tea Party- You can use these apps to have your child follow directions and work on pretend play <u>Bag Game</u>- 20 questions style game, can be used to work on vocabulary skills, using and answering —wh questions, deductive reasoning.

Reading Rainbow- Comes with 5 free stories and then in app purchases. Interactive storybooks with audio.

Sensory Treat- Great app for parents! To help your children develop a sensory diet and find strategies to help them self regulate.

Harding



Paperback by Hartley Steiner.

Delightful, colorful, and full with the information a child needs to know about Sensory Processing Disorder (SPD). Each page starts off with the simple introduction of one of our eight senses and what it does for you. Then Gabriel tells us how that sense is for him. On the last pages of the book, Important Information for Parents, Educators, and Therapists, The author asks for those who work with children who have SPD to help them cope and she lists simple things you can do for the children in your care.



Sensitive Sam: Sam's Sensory Adventure Has a Happy Ending! by Marla Roth-Fisch

The story of Sam, whose over-sensitivity creates chaos and frustration in his life. Sam's various sensory sensitivities adversely affect Sam's experiences, both at home and in the classroom. He walks readers through his typical day of sensory blunders (which many kids and families may find all too familiar!).



<u>Picky, Picky Pete</u> by Michele Griffin

The author is an occupational therapist. This picture book is a must-have for any child with sensory processing disorder. Pete finds his clothes uncomfortable and can't stand "paint, soap, and things with lumps." He explains this to his mother and the reader in this fun children's book, as he and mom navigate a difficult, but typical, morning in the life of a young boy with sensory issues.
